Abstracts should be no longer than 2500 characters.

Presentations should be prepared using PowerPoint (.ppt/.pptx format).

Due to the limited number of oral presentations some authors who have submitted an abstract for an oral presentation might be asked to submit a poster presentation instead.

Posters

Posters should be made in standard poster size 90 cm \times 120 cm (width x height).

Poster award: the scientific committee will select the best poster, which author will be awarded with a Best Poster Award certification.

The material should not have been published elsewhere before the meeting.
